Ordinance No. 583 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTERS 105 AND 106 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OSCEOLA, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO THE DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTE BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Osceola, Iowa: SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 105.10 subsection 1.A of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Osceola, Iowa is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof: A. Residential. Each Dwelling Unit of a Residential Premises shall be provided with one (1) 96 gallon solid waste receptacle and one (1) 96 gallon recycling receptacle. SECTION 2. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 105.11 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Osceola, Iowa is hereby amended with the following addition of subsection 5: 5. Admitted violations imposed by this Code of Ordinances may be charged upon a simple notice of a fine payable at the office of the Police Department. The simple notice of a fine shall be in the amount of fifty dollars (\$50) for all first violations, one hundred dollars (\$100) for all second violations and one hundred fifty (\$150) for all subsequent violations thereafter. SECTION 3. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 105.16 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Osceola, Iowa is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof: 105.16 SANITARY DISPOSAL PROJECT DESIGNATED. The sanitary landfill facilities operated by the South Central Iowa Landfill Agency are hereby designated as the official "Public Sanitary Disposal Project" for the disposal of solid waste produced or originating within the City. SECTION 4. SECTION MODIFIED. Chapter 106 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Osceola, Iowa is hereby amended with the following addition: 106.09 SUSPENSION OF SERVICE. The owner of any one or two family premises served may apply for a temporary suspension of solid waste service. Said application shall state the effective date and end date of the service suspension, reason for the suspension, and shall be subject to City Council approval. SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shal not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereofnot adjudged invalid or unconstitutional. SECTION 6. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

WHEREAS the Board of Trustees of Osceola Water Works has ratified the contract for the purchase of the following described real estate in Clarke County, Iowa, to wit: The south-half of the Northwest Quarter (S1/2nw1/4) and the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (NW1/4SW1/4) and the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (NE1/4SE1/4) of Section 27, Township 73 North, Range 26 West of the 5th P.M., Clarke County, Iowa, and that part of the Northeast Quarter (NE1/4) of the Northeast Quarter (NE1/4) of Section 27 lying West of the Centerline of the public road as now located through the Northeast Quarter (NE1/4) of Section 27, Township 73 North, Range 26 West, of the 5th P.M., Clarke County, Iowa.

Subject to approval by the Osceola City Council; and

WHEREAS the purchase of the above described real estate should be approved; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Osceola, Clarke County, Iowa, that:

The purchase by the City of Osceola of the above described real estate is approved subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The City of Osceola shall only use the above-described real estate for the Clarke County Water Supply Project;
- 2. The City of Osceola shall not sell or otherwise transfer the above-described real estate without first offering to sell the real estate to the Clarke County Reservoir Commission and Osceola Water Works upon the same terms and conditions as offered by a bona fide purchaser and receiving written consent to sell from both entities; and
- 3. The City of Osceola agrees that these covenants and restrictions shall run with the land.

The City administrator is hereby direct to take all actions necessary to complete the purchase of this real estate.
