Tuesday, October 3, 2017 Regular Meeting

The City Council met on Tuesday, October 3, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. for a Regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Thomas J. Kedley. With the following present: Council Members: Douglas Gay, Dave Walkup, Dan Hooper, Dennis Page and George Fotiadis. Terry Keller expressed his concerns for programing within the community for a younger generation, clean up days, and token for water along the safe route.
