Ordinance 661:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 55 OF THE CITY OSCEOLA CODE OF ORDINANCE. BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Osceola, Iowa: SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED. Chapter 55.05 of the City of Osceola, Iowa Code of Ordinances is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof: 55.05 LIVESTOCK. It is unlawful for a person to keep livestock within the City except by written consent of the Council or except in compliance with the City's zoning regulations. 1. Admitted violations imposed by this Code of Ordinances may be charged upon a simple notice of a fine payable at the office of the Police Department. The simple notice of a fine shall be in the amount of fifty dollars (\$50) for all first violations, one hundred dollars (\$100) for all second violations and one hundred fifty (\$150) for all subsequent violations thereafter. SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
