# **Veto Message 02/22/2024**

Pursuant to the powers and duties of the office of Mayor found in Chapter 15.02(4) of the City of Osceola Code of Ordinances, I hereby veto the action taken by the Osceola City Council on February 20, 2024 regarding the closure of the Fern Underwood Family Aquatic Center. My decision to veto this action is based on a desire to see the City take more time to exhaust all possible options before the March 1st deadline to proceed with the aquatic center rehabilitation.

#### Resolution 2024-06:

Expressing intent to enter into General Obligation Corporate Purpose Loan Agreement WHEREAS, the City of Osceola (the "City"), in Clarke County, State of Iowa, has proposed to enter into a General Obligation Corporate Purpose Loan Agreement (the "Loan Agreement") in a principal amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 pursuant to the provisions of Section 384.24A, related to financing the cost, to that extent, of demolition of a blighted building as set forth in the urban renewal amendment, providing for maintenance and improvements and rehabilitation to the swimming pool and aquatic center and the acquisition and purchase of law enforcement equipment, and has published notice of the proposed action and has held a hearing thereon, and WHEREAS, the City intends to enter into the Loan Agreement in the future; and NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Osceola, Iowa, as follows: Section 1.The City Council declares its intent to enter into the Loan Agreement and also declares that this resolution constitutes the "additional action" required by Section 384.24A of the Code of Iowa, with respect to the Loan Agreement. Section 2.All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
